Why Am I Here?

1. God made me to love me!

God says, "I have loved you with an everlasting love!" Jer. 31:3

"Even before the world was made, God had already chosen us to be His through our union with Christ...<u>because of His love</u>. God had already decided that through Jesus Christ He would make us His children — this was God's pleasure and purpose." Eph. 1:4-5 [GN]

2. We were created to <u>enjoy</u> a personal relationship with God and all of the rest of God's creation! This makes us special!

"So God created human beings, making them in His image. He blessed them, and said,...live all over the earth and bring it under control. I am putting you in charge." Gen. 1:27-28 (TLB)

"God richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment." 1 Tim. 6:17

Jesus said, "I have come in order that you might have life — life in all its fullness!" John 10:10

3. When we know and love God, and live in harmony with His purpose for our lives, it produces tremendous benefits in our lives:

What's The Problem?

Man has a natural desire to be boss and to ignore God's principles for living.

"Look out for #1. Do your own thing." "If it feels good, do it - regardless of what God says about it." "It's my life and I'll do what I please!"

The Bible calls this attitude sin.

All of us, like sheep, have gone astray, and each of us has turned to his own way. Isaiah 53:6 If we say that we never sin, we are only fooling ourselves, and refuse to accept the truth. 1 John 1:8

Sin breaks our close relationship with God. It causes us to fear God and try to live our lives outside of His will.

"The trouble is that your sins have cut you off from God." Isaiah 59:2 (LB) "All have sinned and fall short of God's glorious ideal." Romans 3:23

When people have problems, they often try many different ways of coping before turning to God.

Even when we know that our deepest need is God, we often try wrong ways of getting to know Him:

- "My mother was a Christian so..."
- "It doesn't matter what you believe, just be sincere."
- "I'll give up all my bad habits."
- "I'll work real hard and earn it."
- "I'll be religious and go to church."

What's The Solution?

Jesus Christ said: "I AM THE WAY, the Truth, and the Life. No one comes to the Father, except THROUGH ME!" John 14:6

God Himself came to earth as a human being to bring us back to Himself. If any other way would have worked, Jesus Christ would not have had to come. The Way is a Person!

JESUS HAS ALREADY TAKEN CARE OF YOUR SIN PROBLEM!

"The wages of sin in death, BUT the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." Rom. 6:23

God did this for us because He loves us and wants us to know Him.

"God demonstrated His love for us in that while we were still separated from God by sin, Christ died for us." Rom. 5:8

"God is on one side and all people are on the other side, and Christ Jesus is between them to bring them together, by giving His life for all mankind." 1 Tim. 2:5

God has already done His part to restore our relationship to Him. He took the initiative. Now He waits for each of us to individually accept what He has done for us.

What Does God Want Me To Do?

- 1. <u>ADMIT</u> that God has not been first place in your life and ask Him to forgive your sins. "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from every wrong." 1 John 1:9
- 2. <u>BELIEVE</u> that Jesus died to pay for your sins and that he rose again on Easter, and is alive today.

"If you confess that Jesus is your Lord, and you **believe in your heart** that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved." Romans 10:9

"Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name (Jesus) by which we must be saved." Acts 4:12

3. ACCEPT God's free gift of salvation. Don't try to earn it.

"For it is by grace you are saved, through faith — and this not from yourselves, it is the **gift** of **God** — not by works, so that no one can boast." Ephesians 2:8,9

Our relationship to God is not restored by anything we do, but on the basis of what Jesus already did for us!

4. <u>INVITE</u> Jesus Christ to come into your life and be the director ("Lord") of your life.

"To all who receive Him, He gives the right to become children of God. All we need to do is to trust Him to save us. All those who believe this are reborn! — not a physical rebirth...but from the will of God!" John 1:12-13

"Jesus says, 'Listen! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in..." Rev. 3:30

You can take these steps by praying a simple prayer of commitment to God:

"Dear Jesus, thank you for making me and loving me, even when I've ignored you and gone my own way. I realize I need you in my life and I'm sorry for my sins. I ask you to forgive me. Thank you for dying on the cross for me. Please help me to understand it more. As much as I know how, I want to follow you from now on. Please come into my life and make me a new person inside. I accept your gift of salvation. Please help me to grow now as a Christian."

Whoever calls upon the name of the Lord will be saved.

BAPTISM

Why Should I Be Baptized?

1. To follow the example set by <u>Jesus</u>.

"At that time Jesus came from Nazareth and was baptized by John in the river." Mark 1:9

2. Because Christ commands it.

"Jesus said, 'Go then, to all people everywhere and make them my disciples, baptize them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, and then teach them to obey everything I have commanded you."" Matt. 28:19-20

3. It demonstrates that I am a believer.

"...many of the people who heard Him believed and were baptized." Acts 18:8

"We know that we have come to know Him, if we obey His commands." 1 John 2:3

What is the meaning of baptism?

1. It illustrates Christ's death and resurrection

"Christ died for our sins... He was buried...and He rose again." 1 Cor. 15:3-4

"For when you are **baptized**, you were **buried** with Christ, and in baptism you were also **raised** with Christ. Col. 2:12

2. It illustrates my new life as a Christian.

"When someone becomes a Christian he becomes a brand new person inside. The old life has passed away and a new life has begun!" 2 Cor. 5:17

"By our baptism then, we were buried with Him and shared His death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead...so also we may live a new life!" Rom. 6:4

Baptism doesn't make you a believer — it shows that **you already believe**. Baptism does not "save" you, only your faith in Christ does that. Baptism is like a wedding ring — it's the outward symbol of the commitment you made in your heart.

"For it is by grace you have been saved, **through faith**...it is the gift of God — not by works, so that no one can boast." Ephesians 2:8-9

Why Be Baptized By Immersion?

Because Jesus was baptized that way.

"As soon as Jesus was baptized, He went up out of the water." Matthew 3:16

Every baptism in the Bible was by immersion.

[Example] "...then both Philip and the man went down into the water and Philip baptized him. When they came up out of the water..." Acts 8:38-39

The word "Baptize" means to Dip Under water".

The Greek word baptizo means "to immerse or dip under water".

It best symbolizes a burial and resurrection!

The founders of denominations agree:

Martin Luther..."I would have those who are to be baptized to be entirely immersed, as the word imports and the mystery signifies."

John Calvin... "The word 'baptize' signifies to immerse. It is certain that immersion was the practice of the ancient church."

John Wesley... "Buried with Him, alludes to baptizing by immersion according to the custom of the first church."

Who Should Be Baptized?

Every person who has a belief in Christ.

"Those who believed and accepted His message were baptized..." Acts 2:41

"Simon himself believed and was baptized..." Acts 8:13

"But **when they believed** Philip as he preached the Good News...and the name of Jesus Christ, **they were baptized**, both men and women." Acts 8:12

At what age should a child be baptized?

At Northpark, we wait until our children are old enough to believe and understand the true meaning of baptism before we baptize them. Young children who wish to be baptized should express their desire to our Children's Pastor, who can direct them to the next steps. Baptism is not a rite to be exercised by the parents. Rather baptism should be encouraged as soon as a child understands their relationship with Jesus Christ.

A baby or child dedication can be done for parents who wish to dedicate their child to God and promise to raise their child in the faith until the child is old enough to make his own personal confession of Christ.

When Should I Be Baptized?

As soon as you have believed!

"Those who believed...were baptized...that day!" Acts 2:41

"Then Philip began with the scripture and told him the Good News about Jesus. As they traveled along the road, they came to some water, and the man said, 'Look, here is water! Why shouldn't I be baptized right now?' Philip said, 'If you believe with all your heart, you may.' The man answered, 'I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God.' So they went down into the water and Philip baptized him." Acts 8:35-38

Can my family be baptized together?

Yes! If each family member understands fully the meaning of baptism, and each one has personally placed his/her trust in Christ for salvation, we encourage families to be baptized at the same time. It is a wonderful expression of commitment. Young children who wish to be baptized are asked to meet with our children's pastor for a pre-baptism conversation.

What can I expect when I am baptized?

If you are ready to be baptized, you need to contact the church office to schedule an appointment to meet with a pastor. At that point, you will be asked to record a very brief video – just a few sentences stating who you are and why you want to be baptized.

On the day you are baptized, you will need to come prepared with a towel and a change of clothes if you wish. You can wear shorts and a t-shirt, or anything modest you are comfortable getting wet in (please no white or light colored t-shirts). You will sit in the front section of chairs near the baptismal tank until it is time for baptisms. The pastor will briefly explain the meaning of baptism. When it is your turn to be baptized, your video introduction will be played while you get situated in the tank. The pastor will then briefly lower you just under the water, and then you can leave the pool, dry off, and watch the others. Later we will make available a certificate of your baptism. We encourage you to invite all your relatives and friends to attend your baptism.

THE LORD'S SUPPER (COMMUNION)

Jesus never asked His disciples to remember His birth. But He did instruct them to remember His death and resurrection. He gave the church two visible symbols (called *"ordinances"*) as reminders of His death. These two ordinances are: Baptism and The Lord's Supper. The Lord's Supper is an object lesson that represents a great spiritual truth for believers.

What Is The Lord's Supper? (1 Cor. 11:23-26)

- 1. It is a <u>Simple Act</u>. "The Lord Jesus, on the night He was betrayed, took bread..." (vs. 23)
- 2. It is a Reminder "...and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, 'This is my body, which is for you; eat it in remembrance of me." [vs. 24]
- 3. It is a <u>Symbol</u>. "In the same way, He took the cup, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood; drink it to remember me." (vs. 25)
- **4.** It is a <u>Statement of Faith</u>. "For whenever you eat the bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes back." (vs. 26)

Who Should Take The Lord's Supper?

Only those who are already **Believers**. [Mark 14:22-26]

"For anyone who eats and drinks <u>without recognizing the body of the Lord</u> eats and drinks judgment upon himself." 2Cor.11:29

How Do I Prepare Myself?

"Therefore whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. <u>A person ought to examine himself</u> before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup." 1 Cor. 11:27-28

When Do We Observe The Lord's Supper?

At Northpark, we have communion once a month, usually on the third Sunday of the month during our regular Sunday morning services.
