BIBLE STORY

Jesus Walks on Water

(Matthew 14:22-33)

Our Bible story begins after Jesus miraculously fed about five thousand people. Jesus instructed his disciples to go ahead of him to the other side of the lake. The disciples did as he said, and Jesus went up to a mountain to pray. Night came and the disciples—still on the lake—found themselves in the midst of a storm. Early in the morning, they saw the figure of a man walking toward them on the lake. They were terrified and screamed, thinking it was a ghost! They didn't know it was Jesus until he said, "Be encouraged! It's me. Don't be afraid" (verse 27). Peter said, "Lord, if it's you, order me to come to you on the water." And Jesus said, "Come." (verses 28-29). Peter took a few steps toward Jesus on the water. Then Peter felt a strong wind, became frightened, and began to sink. He shouted, "Lord, rescue me!" Jesus reached out and grabbed him and said, "You man of weak faith! Why did you begin to have doubts?" (verses 30-31).

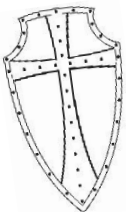
