Our hearts can relate to stories - stories that remind us of who we are and can be, or remind us of someone we care about that we wish a more joyful life for. It has been my privilege to hear over 120 stories from our amazing speakers in the decade-plus of being part of 9 to 5 for Christ. I started as an attendee, became part of the set-up crew, took on the Mistress of Ceremonies role, and in this past year I have been a co-chair. These stories have guided my life and created a safe place for me to invite friends and family who need to hear a story of how Jesus can change any life, including theirs. These stories have launched me into networks where I can go for help, and where I can help others I cross paths with to access needed services.

9 to 5 taps the faith-based talent of women from our community and brings us together to be refreshed once a month. When the ministry began, working women were the focused audience. Well, sisters, we are *all* working women, so the target audience is now all of us. The core belief of 9 to 5 has not changed: the message of Christ is the difference-maker in any "work" setting, both inside and outside the home.

The Covid-19 cloud sent many of us into working from home which escalated the need to hear stories, from our speakers and our table mates, about how we could sustain sanity and hope when crazy seemed to be running loose in all of the environments we needed to be in...school, hospitals, stores, repair shops, other people's homes, and yes, in our own homes.

NORTHPARK'S FIRST ANNUAL CAR SHOW

The results are in!

First off, I want to be sure to say thank you to each and every one of you for making this day go as smoothly as it did!! None of this could have happened if it weren't for all of you.

Here are some stats from the event:

- After all the expenses were deducted, we were able to raise \$3,600!! I think for our first time out, and considering the short time frame we had to plan, this is a very good total.
- We had 90 cars that registered and paid, 4 food vendors, and 14 craft vendors.
- We also had over 40 volunteers from Northpark women's ministy, men's ministry, and youth who came out to help!
- We didn't do a formal count of attendees, but I think it is safe to say that there were between 300-400 people in attendance throughout the day.

I think the most exciting part for me was seeing all the different people who attended this event. Many of the attendees were people who, by their own admission, would not set foot on a church campus, but were willing to show up for a car show. In doing so, we not only introduced them to Northpark, but to all the different ministries we support since each car registered was given a brochure about our different ministries.

God showed up in so many ways for this event, right down to the perfect weather! I'm looking forward to next year when we can take all that we did well, learn from the areas we need to improve upon, and then do it all over again!
