SPIRITUAL GROWTH

As always, we are focusing on being intentional and this year was no different. We focused on being disciples of Christ Jesus, having not only intellectual knowledge of Christ Jesus, but also putting it into practice in our daily lives.

Wednesday night classes for all ages continue to be a great opportunity for us all to grow in our faith and also in relationship with one another [and also enjoy a great meal together!]

This past year we offered two options for our adults classes for each of our mid-week sessions. The first mid-week session was a video series called "Not a Fan" by Kyle Idleman. It was a study that challenged us to be more than just a fan of Jesus and to become a follower of him. Dr. Jim Rossi also taught a class walking us through 'The Journey' (Biblical Pathways to Spiritual Maturity).

Our second session of mid-week classes, we did a video study from RightNow Media titled 'Unstuck'. This was a study of how to get out of a rut in our spiritual life and walk with Christ. The other class was taught by Dr. Jim Rossi, who began an in depth study of book of Acts. He always does a wonderful job leading - teaching us the background and history of this book of the Bible, and how it applies to us today.

One of the important parts of our mid-week classes is a time for small group discussions to follow up the great teachings. This also gives the opportunity for people to get to know one another just a little more.

We have kicked off our first session of mid-week at Northpark this February, 2024 with the second half of the study of the book of Acts taught by Dr. Jim Rossi and a video study on RightNow Media by Tony Evans called "The Power of Knowing God."

RightNow Media is another great resource we introduced this year. This extensive library has more than 20,000 videos taught by Christian leaders and speakers. These Bible study videos can be used as part of a group study or for family or personal devotions, and many series include free discussion quides and handouts.

Our church believes that RightNow Media is a tool that can help you live out your faith in every area of your life—at home, at work, and in your community. You can sign up for your free account or get more information at NorthparkChurch.org/RightNow.

We have and will continue provide opportunities for leadership training, men's breakfast groups, online Bible studies, and Hume Lake Men's retreat.

WORSHIP & ARTS

2023 was a fantastic year in the Northpark Worship Ministry. It was another year of building into the ministry by reaching those who are already serving in the ministry and bringing them together more.

We so often only come together through our Sunday morning gatherings for service and don't have the opportunity to get to know others in the ministry in a more relaxed and laid-back setting. So, one of the things that we started doing as a ministry was gathering outside of normal church assemblies for what I started calling our **Northpark Worship Ministry Family Meetings**. This was a time to just get together and hang out with our families and spend time together. The worship team, tech team and choir were all invited to join in these gatherings, and we are looking forward to having more of those this coming year to help bolster our unity in the group.

Another thing that I started was a **devotional series** on our Tuesday night rehearsals during our prayer time with the worship team. We went through the book *Shaping Worship* by Pastor Steve Baney. Some of the topics were about order, excellence, and humility as we, the worship ministry, lead our church every Sunday. This was such a good series and a time of reflection for us that I decided to do another series for this year, *Before We Gather* by Zac Hicks. I purchased books for everyone in the worship ministry so we can go through it together as a whole group (worship team, tech team and choir) throughout the year. So far this has been a positive addition to our rehearsals. I encourage anyone to pick up either of these books if they are looking for a good study.

But what may have been one of the best new additions in the last year was starting our **G.L.O.W.** (**God Loves Our Worship**) **services** on one Sunday evening per month. Each time we met the service was different, from one being all hymns, to another with us all seated in the round with more of an unplugged feel. But every service offered a time of extended worship, prayer and scripture and helped those who attended to focus on God. It was also a time for our worship ministry to invite people from outside of our ministry to join us in leading the church. The feedback from the people who gathered for these was very positive and it is something that I am very much looking forward to doing again this year.

I also need to thank a few people who keep this ministry running smoothly, and make it a joy to come and lead this group of volunteers:

Nathan Bjaaland has continued to lead and oversee the tech ministry with excellence and keep things running behind the scenes so that Sunday services are presented both in person and online in a very professional way. Her creativity has shined in her decorations as shown by the giant crown of thorns that was hung in the middle of the stage for Easter last year.

Ryan Nyberg has continued to lead our choir with passion and integrity, and I cannot imagine our Northpark services without his help leading the choir. Every time the choir steps on stage it is a treat for not only me, but for the Northpark family as well.

And finally, **Ashley Bjaaland** has been a tremendous help both behind the scenes and in front of the church leading us in worship. She has grown in her abilities as a worship leader, and I am excited to see where God takes her in the future.

We have had the chance to revamp our stage little by little with the addition of a new stage section I am calling the "Preaching Perch," which gives Pastor Bob his own little portion of the stage. We have new rugs, and paint to help spruce up the walls and floors. New signage in the worship center shows

our church mission statement. In the coming year, I look to continue some ongoing projects, updating the drum cage, purchasing new screens and stage lights.

As the Northpark Worship Ministry has begun this new year, I found myself really wondering what our focus should be for 2024. I found my answer in the theme of this year's 21 Days of Prayer and Fasting; unity. I feel that our world needs unity more than ever, and as a ministry that is seen publicly here at Northpark, we need to have that at our core. Jesus prayed in John 17 for the church to have unity, and when the church is unified great things happen. I pray for unity in our church, and for our ministry to lead people in one voice declaring that Jesus Christ is Lord over this city and ascribing the glory that is only for Him.

Let us take this year and worship Christ with abandon and watch and see how God works throughout our city.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

Northpark "KIDS on the GROW": Where God is Rocking Our World!

Our mission is that our kids grow in their faith, love of Jesus, understanding of God, and personal relationship with Jesus. Our goal is that children and volunteers CONNECT, TAKE ACTION and GROW in their character to become more like Christ!

2023 AT-A-GLANCE:

BAPTISMS: 8 kids were baptized during the year.

VOLUNTEERS: Our team consists of 42 Adult and 11 Youth volunteers for Sunday morning and Wednesday night classes. Each week a new lesson, activities and opportunities are made possible by this team. Each Sunday morning, it takes a minimum of 18 volunteers to execute classes for our kids. As you can see from the total numbers, our KIDS on the Grow team can definitely use more hands and feet!

CHILDCARE TEAM: We employ Northpark High School and College age students to work on our childcare team. We know that it is a big help to provide childcare for parents so they can attend services, practices, events, and meetings here.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY ASSISTANT: Laurynn Meyer continues to work part-time for Northpark and our children. Her dedication to our program, the kids and the logistics needed to keep our events and services running smoothly is a big help. Laurynn is studying youth ministry online at Grand Canyon University in hopes of going into children's ministry in the future!

SUNDAYS 8:30 AM - JUNIOR BIBLE QUIZ: This is our "Going Deeper with God for Kids" class for ages Kindergarten to 6th grade. Kids are learning facts about the Bible as well as memorizing scripture, then in a trivia quiz format they "buzz in" and answer questions they've learned. There are opportunities to compete quarterly as well as against other churches in the Central Valley. We hosted one of the competitions here with over 50 in attendance from Visalia, Hanford and San Jose. We added a Teen Bible Quiz team this year with 5 youth meeting Sundays after church!

SUNDAYS 10:00 AM: We have a full line-up of 6 different age/grade appropriate classrooms ranging from infants to 6th grade. Our teaching/caring teams consist of adults and youth working together to implement the teachings of Jesus while focusing on our Mission – GROWing kids in their spiritual journey. On average we are sharing Christ with 65 kids every Sunday.

STUDIO 56 (5th/6th GRADE): For our pre-teen kids, (who meet Sundays during the 10 am service) we continue to focus on connecting and building relationships with each other, while at the same time, connecting and growing in their relationship with God. Outside of our Sunday classes, we have found that group activities and gatherings really meet the goal of connecting! These activities are a great way for kids to invite a friend and feel safe. On average, 25 kids have attended each of these events/parties.

MID-WEEK CLASSES: Wednesday nights have proven to be full of FUN, FELLOWSHIP and GROWing closer to God. Memorizing Bible Scripture each week and participating in interactive stories and activities have really connected these kids with each other and with God. We used the series "13 Very Bad Days" and "13 Very Surprising Sayings" to dig deep into growing with God. Also, our class for our 5 years old and younger focus on Bible stories every Wednesday to learn more about Jesus.

HUME SUMMER CAMPS: We continue to grow in the number of kids that are going to camp. This year we sent 92 campers along with 21 counselors. At all three camps, Elementary, Jr High and High School, life changing experiences happened. We witnessed one of our youth getting baptized in Hume Lake. 7 campers asked God into their lives and there were many heart changes that occurred on that mountain top. We are truly privileged to continue to attend HUME Camps where they offer the most amazing opportunities to meet God and build relationships!

HUME CAMP FUNDING: \$4420 was raised by the kids during our PASTA Fundraiser and YOU, Northpark contributed another \$16,063 towards camp scholarships! THANK YOU! Camps continue to rise in costs, so your scholarships, donations, prayers, and support mean so much to getting our kids to camp.

SUMMER ADVENTURE - "HERO HOTLINE": This year 196 kids, ages 4 years old - 6th grade were "Called Together to Serve God". This is a great outreach for our kids and our community - 22% of the kids that attended do not usually attend church. 112 adult and youth volunteers made this possible, working 5 weeknights in July. We also witnessed 42 kids asking Jesus into their hearts!

An UNBELIEVEABLE MOMENT occurred the final night of our week when it was announced the amount our kids raised for our Mission Project! We adopted the "Angels of Grace" Foster Family Agency this year and our goal was to raise \$2500 for them. OUR NORTHPARK KIDS AND FRIENDS RAISED OVER...\$4500 and they personally got to witness the surprised look on the Executive Director's face when she was presented that check! WOW! Our Friday Family Fun Night was celebrated with over 350 people in attendance enjoying desserts from 2 different food trucks, as well as games, waterslides, a bounce house and music!

KIDS & YOUTH PARENT MEETING: New Youth Pastor Justin Goble and I hosted for the first time a joint Kids & Youth parent meeting. We laid out our plan to move, teach and train kids from Nursery through High School and how that looks growing relationally and spiritually in their lives. We shared our vision which is to prepare our next generations to become the church of tomorrow!

KIDS CHRISTMAS MUSICAL DRAMA PRODUCTION – "THE CHRISTMAS EXPRESS": It's been a while since the kids have performed a full musical drama production, but 19 kids were absolutely committed to doing that this year for you. The kids committed to practices every week, sometimes twice a week for 2 ½ months. We had 5 adult leaders and 4 youth leaders working with the kids to put the program together and present it during our Sunday services!

PANCAKE BREAKFAST & FAMILY FUN: We hosted a back-to-school kick-off in August inviting our Northpark family and the community to join us for pancakes, waterslides, games, and a foam bubble pit (which was a hit)! We estimated 300-350 adults and children joined us on that Saturday morning!

CARE CHRISTMAS BAGS: For our Christmas Project this year we chose to support children and their families that are in the hospital at Community Regional Medical Center in the PICU (pediatric care unit). Having one of our very own experience a life threatening event the previous year, we chose to put our prayers into action and gathered items that kids and their families could use while they were in the hospital during the holiday season. Our goal was to take 25 "Care" bags to them, and we delivered 27 bags. Every bag included a blanket, a gift card to Target, games, snacks, toiletries, and other items. THANK YOU for your generous donations once again!

- We were excited to welcome new youth volunteers this year! Megan Barbeau and Kari Folweiler joined leadership and have been serving with all their hearts, making powerful connections.

2023 Recap

At the beginning of year, the group continued to focus on unity and basics of faith, and a teaching series on the book of John. There was a 'groovy' 70's themed movie night as they watched 'Jesus Revolution' and talked about how to share their faith with others, and the parallels that could be drawn between their own situations and the story in the movie!

God was so good and blessed Northpark Women's Ministries with another action-packed year in 2023!

Our November **Holiday Boutique** was a huge success! As always, our ladies worked tirelessly to create baskets, crafts, baked goods, set up jewelry, and so much more. As a result, we made over \$23,000! Once again, we were able to partner with our Northpark youth. They were the personal shoppers for several of the ladies, and in turn, earned credit towards summer camp at Hume Lake.

We hosted our second annual **Car Show** and made over \$8,000. The turnout was bigger than last year with over 100 cars registered and well over 400 people from the community attended. We even made the evening news! We had 22 craft and food vendors. All 6 of the ministries we support sent representatives who got up and spoke about what they do.

The profits from these two fundraisers not only helped us to support our youth with camp credit, but it also gave us the opportunity to **continue to give financially to the following ministries**:

- Ron (Pup), Anastasia Nelson, and Zach Nelson with Fellowship of Christian Athletes
- Justice Coalition
- The Lighthouse Recovery Center
- Pregnancy Care Center
- The Graber family
- Angels of Grace
- and this year we added Medical Ministries International

Throughout the year, we had several ongoing fellowship opportunities as well.

Our **weekly Bible studies** continued to meet throughout the year. Wednesday mornings are led by Margarita Navarette. Tuesday evenings are led by Robyn Scroggins. This year, during the summer and winter breaks, the ladies tried something new and started a book club. This gave them an opportunity to meet and discuss the faith-based fiction book they read. Overall, I think this was a huge success and something we will continue to do since the ladies enjoyed it so much.

This year, under the direction of Cheryl Tristan, we have been hosting weekly **women's Beginner Yoga** classes. These meetings average anywhere from 10-20 ladies and offers a Christ focused time of self care for all physical abilities. This has been a great way for people in the community to connect with Northpark. Cheryl also offered a Saturday morning yoga class at our retreat this year!

Kim Tatham hosted our **Women's Fun Nights**, and as always, Bunco was a HUGE hit!! The ladies look forward to these events where they can relax, laugh, and enjoy some tasty treats. The great part about these fun nights is that the ladies of Northpark often invite friends who attend other churches and some who don't attend church at all. So, they come, have some fun, then Kim always concludes with a little something from the word of God.

Our monthly **9 to 5 for Christ** meetings continue to grow as ladies from Northpark and throughout the community come together to pray for one another, eat a great meal, and hear an amazing speaker. This is such a blessing to those in and out of the workplace and it is also a great networking opportunity for those looking for employment. We are so thankful for Joyce Eden and her team for organizing this event each month.

This year, our **MOPS (Mothers of Preschoolers)** group welcomed a new coordinator, Sabrina Bjaaland. She has done an amazing job! MOPS meets bi-monthly and includes women who attend Northpark, other churches, and some who do not attend church at all. This meeting gives mothers of preschoolers an opportunity to fellowship with others who are in the same season of life.

Our **New Beginnings Luncheons**, which meet quarterly, has continued to grow. Hosted by Dar Rossi and her team, these luncheons are attended by ladies from all over the valley and welcome an average of 160 women at each event. These ladies partner with Teen Challenge to set up, prepare, and clean up - and this is no small task. The attendees are asked to bring items for whichever ministry is being highlighted that quarter. They are so generous in their giving, that at times it has taken 2 loads just to transport everything!

Lastly, we were once again able to host a **Women's Retreat at Calvin Crest**. Last year's retreat was such a success that we decided we would go again. We had 40 ladies register. Pastor Candi Maur was our speaker and as usual, she did an amazing job. Our worship team was May Bruckner and Sydney Oscarson. The ladies were so blessed by them.

Our theme was "To the Full - Moving from Surviving to Thriving." The ladies were encouraged to see themselves as God sees them. The weekend went so well that before we even left the retreat, several of them came up to us and asked if we were doing this again in 2024.

I am always overwhelmed with gratitude when I look back at all that God allowed us to do. FINANCIAL REPORT

as of December 31, 2023

Prepared by Pastor Bob Fuller, Administrative Pastor

This financial report is to give you, the Northpark membership and regular adherents, a view of Northpark's financial condition.

You, in accordance with principles of giving directed by the Lord Jesus, are the source of Northpark's financial resources. You entrust the staff and Board of Trustees to steward those resources in ways that facilitate Northpark's God-directed mission and purpose.

As you view the financial facts in this report, bear in mind that these resources were expended on the ministry activities which supported this purpose, which are described in the accompanying reports from the various Northpark ministry leaders.

FINANCIAL POSITION AT END OF CALENDAR 2022:

- We have \$667,881 in the 'bank.' Of that total, \$368,866 is available for operation (55%). This provides approximately 4 months of operating reserve. (Operations cost approximately \$90,000 per month.) The other 45% is earmarked as building fund, church plant fund, and special designated gifts.
- We presently have **no long-term debt**. The mortgage was paid off in 2021.
- Our net financial position is up about 1% from end of prior year.
 Most of that increase is due to the building/courtyard fund donations in 2023.

CASH FLOW - OPERATIONS IN CALENDAR 2023

Note: This section notes highlights; details are given in charts and diagrams following.

RECEIPTS:

General fund giving: \$974,814.

- This is approximately 4% less than the prior year and approximately 6% less than the original budget projection.
- This amount was given by 240 Giving Units (a GU is a family unit or a single person). 90% of the funds came from 50% of the giving units.
 - 2023 Giving Units were about 10% fewer than the prior year.

Other Receipts:

- Outreach/Missions donations: \$49,018 which was 32% less than the prior year.
- Facilities/building fund/Courtyard fund donations: \$169,774
- Facility use fees (Heart Christian Academy school): \$42,600.

Total Receipts:

 \$1,236,628 - up 10% from prior year - attributable mostly to Courtyard donations and facility use fee from Heart Christian Academy

EXPENDITURES:

Operational expenses are categorized as shown below. Each category includes personnel costs associated with that facet of operation.

*This is the information that should be viewed in conjunction with the activity reports of all the ministry areas of Northpark as noted in the introduction to this report.

Ministry - all on-campus and local ministry activities, for adults, children, youth.

42% of total income - this percentage is consistent with the previous year.

Outreach/Missions/Benevolence -designated and undesignated outgo to missions and needs.

7% of total income – the target percentage of 10% was not reached in 2023.

Administration – ministry support, financial management

29% of total income – this percentage is consistent with the prior year.

Facilities – maintenance, equipment, projects

23% of total income – this percentage is higher than previous years, primarily due to the significant increase in electrical use cost.

Facilities Improvements – permanent building projects

0% of total income – no major facility expenditures other than toward courtyard

Financing - mortgage or other long-term liabilities

0% - no current long-term debt. Going forward, a loan availability for the Courtyard project has been established if needed. None of those funds have yet been drawn.

Reserves/Contingencies/Set-asides - savings, church plant set-aside, facility reserves.

Less than 1% of total income this year - less this past year due to decreased income

Total Net Income/Expense

In 2023, our **operational expenditures were about 1% less than income**, not including Courtyard donations and expenditures to date.

FUTURE: CASH FLOW CONSIDERATIONS FOR 2024

Normal Operations:

Expected to continue more or less consistently as past year. With inflation, costs of various things are going to increase, which must be considered in planning.

Courtyard Improvement Project:

In 2022, church leadership and the congregation authorized an architectural design for a fully covered, multi-season courtyard structure. The design was completed and submitted for construction estimate. The projected construction cost was about \$1.5M, significantly more than the leadership wanted to take on. So the Board opted to not continue with construction of that design. Rather, the focus went to mitigation of the potential safety risk of the deteriorating beams. To that end, the Board engaged the services of a demolition company to remove the covering and beams.

Then in 2023, in consultation with Andrew Young Construction of Fresno, leadership considered and opted to commence a significantly less expensive option for a covered courtyard.

The proposal was submitted to the congregation and fund-raising commenced.



Total cost for this new design is about \$450,000.

As of end of 2023, the status of the project is:

Design and engineering of the structure is complete; the permitting process with the City of Fresno has commenced; the steel structure is in production. The rest of the demolition and construction of the new structure is expected in early spring, with projected completion in late spring.

Funds are projected as follows:

Total Cost: \$450,000

Fundraising:

Target \$320,000

- Pledged amount to date \$270,000 over 3 years
- Received to date \$169,000.
- Short term loan (3 year payoff) \$220,000 is available draw amount only as necessary
- From church reserves \$60,000 \$100,000 as necessary

CONCLUSION

Thank you for the opportunity to serve you as Church Administrator for the past 17+ years. It has been and continues to be my honor to serve the Lord in this capacity.


